This presentation will go through best practices in coaching, evidence behind how to coach most effectively, and solutions to common problems related to coaching. Preschool, school age and adult populations will be discussed. We will also share tips related to conducting evaluations in a virtual platform, as well as practical implementation suggestions for virtual sessions including data collection.

She earned her master's degree from Purdue University and has worked in pediatric settings throughout her career, including schools, outpatient facilities, and early intervention in natural environments. Paula currently provides early intervention in Cuyahoga County using the coaching model, working with families and children in their natural environments.
